Director, Church Engagement

Under the supervision of the president, the director of church engagement helps lead the organization's efforts to educate and engage Christian churches and pastors on cultural issues. This role requires someone who can build relationships with local churches and pastors, effectively communicate and teach our key issues, and build awareness of resources and programs that IFPC offers to churches.

Preferred Qualifications:

- Experience serving in churches, either as a pastor or staff
- Has received theological training, such as Bible college or advanced seminary education
- Possesses awareness of denominational distinctives and capable of navigating relationships with Christians from a wide range of theological traditions
- Familiarity with various churches and Christian communities across the state
- Proven development skills

Responsibilities:

- Church Engagement (50%)
 - Pursue and maintain relationships with churches and pastors throughout the state
 - Increase awareness of IFPC programs with the goal of greater church participation
 - Disseminate IFPC updates and action alerts with goal of greater church awareness and participation
 - Distribute biblical worldview materials and resources, including non-partisan voters guides, to churches
 - Recruit host churches and volunteers for Biblical Activism Bootcamp trainings, rallies, and other events
 - Increase the number of churches that financially partner with IFPC
 - Organize and lead regular pastors' briefings
- Church Education (25%)
 - Speak at Biblical Activism Bootcamps and other organizational events
 - Help plan and execute Biblical Activism Bootcamp events at local churches
 - Seek opportunities to speak at church services, church events, bible studies, and small groups
 - Draft content for emails, video, sermons, studies, or other resources for yourself, the organization, and, as needed, with or on behalf of the President
 - Assist with the development and creation of a small group curriculum on biblical worldview and cultural engagement
- Church Liaison Network (25%)
 - Develop the church liaison network and recruit church liaisons from churches across the state
 - Provide trainings and regular video/phone updates for church liaisons
 - Support church liaisons with resources for increasing church engagement
