

CHILDREN'S SCHOOL AND LIBRARY PROTECTION ACT

Creates a statewide policy that prohibits schools and libraries from distributing pornographic materials to minor children.

THE CHILDREN'S SCHOOL AND LIBRARY PROTECTION ACT:

- Does not ban any books—it simply requires that schools and libraries take reasonable steps to restrict children's access to pornographic materials
- Ensures that taxpayer money is not used to provide pornographic materials to minor children
- Includes exemption for works that possess "serious literary, artistic, political, or scientific value for minors"
- Contains no criminal penalties—instead, violations could result in civil liability

This legislation uses the **MODIFIED MILLER TEST**, promulgated by the **U.S. SUPREME COURT**, to define which materials qualify as "harmful to minors"
