



SCHOOL BATHROOMS

(SB 1100)



Creates a statewide policy ensuring separate school restrooms and changing facilities for biological boys and biological girls.

Under this legislation, public schools would:


- Designate restrooms and changing facilities for male persons only or female persons only;
- Take reasonable steps to ensure students and adults use the facilities designated for their biological sex; and
- Provide reasonable accommodations for any student who is unwilling or unable to use communal restrooms or changing facilities designated for his or her biological sex.

All students deserve **PRIVACY** and **SAFETY** in vulnerable places like restrooms, showers, and dressing areas.

QUICK FACTS

- Title IX, the federal law requiring equal educational opportunities for girls, has always allowed schools to maintain separate bathrooms and living accommodations for biological boys and biological girls
- Federal courts have long recognized that inherent and enduring differences between the biological sexes allow for reasonable sex-based distinctions, including separate restrooms, dressing areas, and shower facilities
