

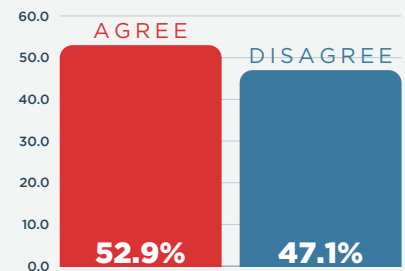


IDAHO FAMILY POLICY POLL

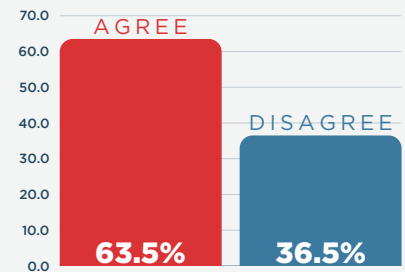

The “Idaho Family Policy Poll” was conducted from January 8-10, 2025, using interactive voice response (IVR) technology with calls to a mix of mobile and landline phone numbers. Respondents were randomly selected from a sample of likely voters, defined as voters who had voted in at least two of the previous four general elections. Quotas were used to ensure a geographically representative sample. Results include those who expressed support or opposition from 401 completed surveys, representing a margin of error of 4.9% and a confidence interval of 95%.

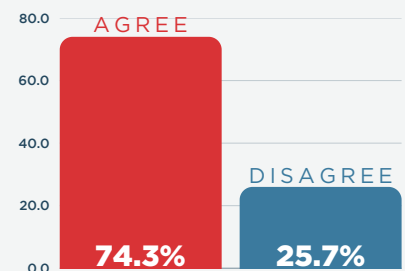

3. Currently, Idaho allows biologically male inmates to be housed in state women’s prisons. How much do you agree or disagree with the following statement: “State prisons should not allow biologically male inmates to use female restrooms, showers, and other intimate facilities.”

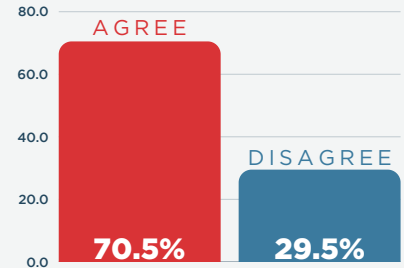




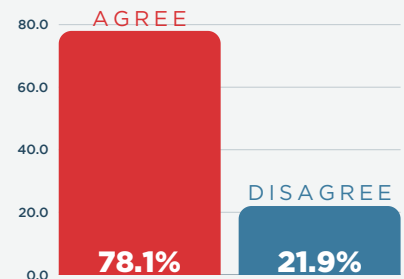

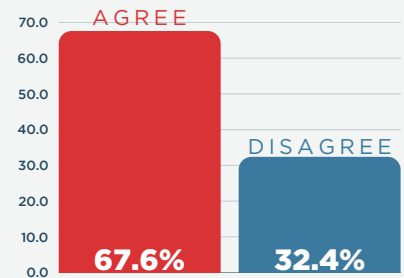

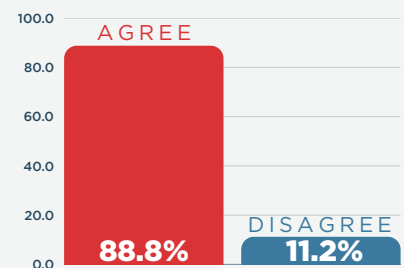

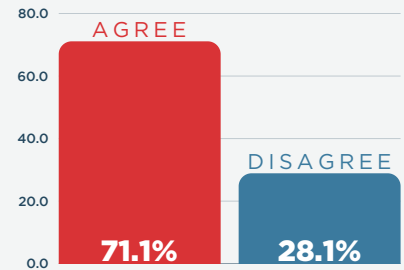
